



Open Rank Tenure-Track Faculty Position: Nonprofit and Public Management and Leadership

Applicants must have completed or be nearing completion of all Ph.D. degree requirements. Successful candidates will likely have or be nearing completion of doctorates in nonprofit management, public administration, public management and leadership, public policy, business, or a related field. Highly desirable candidates will have practical experience, university teaching experience, a strong potential for developing a successful research portfolio, and demonstrated success in working with diverse populations and a commitment to diversifying the profession.
