Best Book Award

The Best Book Award selection committee for the Public and Nonprofit Division of the Academy of Management is requesting nominations for the division's 2013 Best Book award. Books nominated should have publications dates of 2011, 2012, or 2013.

Members of the Public and Nonprofit Division pay special attention to how distinctive qualities of the public and nonprofit sectors influence management and organizational processes. Books nominated for the Award should significantly contribute to modern management theory and/or practice and address issues within the Public and Nonprofit Division's domain of interest. Author membership in the Division or the Academy of Management is not a criterion in the award process. Because of the interest in the substantive intellectual contribution of the book, nominations of textbooks, or books of previously published papers are discouraged. The winning author (s) will receive a plaque recognizing the award.

Full nominations are due March 1, 2014. For a full nomination, please send one copy of a nominated book to each member of the award committee.

Academy of Management Annual Meeting Related Awards

Masini Award

The Carlo Masini Award for outstanding scholarship in the fields of public and nonprofit management will be presented to the best paper from across the entire Academy of Management which examines the behavior of public and/or nonprofit organizations. Winners

of the award will receive a \$2000 prize in recognition of their achievement. This award is created by IPAS (Institute for Public and Health Administration) - Bocconi University of Milan in recognition the lifetime achievements of Prof. Carlo Masini to the field of public management.

How the Award Works:

Eligibility: Only papers that have been submitted to and accepted by the Public and Nonprofit Division will be eligible for the award. All accepted papers are eligible including those that have been nominated or selected for other awards given by the PNP division.

Selection:

A panel of international scholars from public and non-profit management will constitute a selection committee which will be responsible for making the award. The Chair of the selection committee will review the pool of accepted papers in conjunction with the PNP program chair and develop a short list of nominated papers for consideration by the selection committee. The selection committee will review papers on the basis of the overall creativity and innovativeness of the research as well as the significance of the contribution to PNP scholarship.

Recognition: The winner of the Masini Award will be recognized at the business meeting of the Public and Nonprofit Division. Nominated papers will also be invited to participate in a discussion of their work in the Masini Symposium.

Charles H. Levine Award for Best Conference Paper

Each year, the Division presents the Charles H. Levine Award for Best Conference Paper, sponsored generously by Routledge, to the author (or authors) of the best paper presented at the annual Conference. The winning author(s) will be announced in the Conference program and will receive a plaque recognizing the award during the Public and Nonprofit Division's business meeting at the 2014 Academy of Management conference, as well as a gift certificate for books published by Routledge. All papers submitted to the division for consideration at the annual conference are eligible for the award. The award selection is based on the evaluations received from reviewers of conference papers submitted to the Division.

Best Conference Paper by A Doctoral Student

Each year, the Division presents an Award for the Best Conference Paper by a Doctoral Student, sponsored generously by Sage Publications, to the author of the best paper presented at the annual Conference by a doctoral student. All papers submitted to the division for consideration at the annual conference, whose author identifies herself or himself as a doctoral student, are eligible for the award. The award selection is based on the evaluations received from reviewers of conference papers submitted to the Division.

The winner will be announced in the Conference program and will receive a plaque recognizing the award during the Public and Nonprofit Division's business meeting at the 2014 Academy of Management conference in Philadelphia, PA, as well as a gift certificate for books from Sage Publications.

AOM-PNP Top Ten Reviewer Award

Sponsored by the Journal of Public Administration Research and Theory The Journal of Public Administration Research and Theory (JPART) will give a plaque and a \$50 Amazon gift card in recognition of each of the top ten reviewers of conference paper submissions to the Public and Nonprofit Division of the Academy of Management Annual Meeting (AOM-PNP).

Winners will be based on the ratings from AOM-PNP's reviewer ratings process, identified by the AOM-PNP Program Chair, confirmed by the JPART Editor, and recognized at the PNP Business Meeting on Sunday August 3rd.

Reviews will be judged based on the information and guidelines provided by the Academy of Management, below. To reiterate these standards, we seek reviewers who:

**Set a positive tone in their critique;

**Write a substantive but concise review, typically between one to two pages;

**Guide the authors on how the manuscript can be improved.

AOM-PNP conference paper reviewers who are members of PNP will automatically be considered for the award. Three of the ten awards will be reserved for doctoral student members of PNP. PNP members are limited to one award every other year.
